School Sanctions

If the rules are broken we use

- A verbal warning is issued for the child to correct their behaviour
- A written warning
- Timeout
- Miss part or all of their playtime - if a child misses 5 playtimes in a month their parents will be notified.
- Sent to the Head teacher

We believe in working together with parents and pupils to solve difficulties.
